Accept and Value Dance

Go outside to play the game. Chose questions for how are we the same and questions for how are we different from the list below. Have students go into the middle of the circle when they are the same as the statement. Have them all make the American Sign Language sign for yes (fist 'nodding'). When it is a difference, do a celebratory hand sign (wave hands in the air and **everybody** does it to celebrate the difference).
