Discussion Questions for Charlotte's Web (age 5+):

- **1.** Families can discuss the importance of words and their role in *Charlotte's Web*. How are words important for <u>communicating</u>? How do they help shape our impressions of others?
- **2.** How do the animals come to see one another as friends, even though at first, they're put off by their differences?
- **3.** If you've read the book, how does the movie compare to what you imagined in your head?
- **4.** How do the characters in *Charlotte's Web* demonstrate compassion and integrity? Why are these important character traits?

Ways to Reinforce This Lesson at Home:

Make a Beautiful and Unique Bouquet

Materials: construction paper, scissors, glue, or multi-colored tissue paper and pipe cleaners

Have everyone in the family make a flower (or even 2 or 3). After, look at each flower individually and talk about how it is unique and different. Then put them all together and show how well they work in a bouquet. Relate this discussion to how each person adds something to a group and together these unique individuals make a special "bouquet".

- What is something special you can do for your family?
- What do you like about yourself?
- Tell each family member what you find special about them.
- What can you do as a family to get to know about people from other cultures?
